erat in Sicilia templum Herculi sacrum. ibi statua pulchra et praeclara dei stabat. olim Gaius Verres, qui provinciam Siciliam administrabat, ad templum noctu servos misit. quamquam custodes templum magna cum virtute defenderunt, servi irruerunt. cives a custodibus, qui clamores tollunt, excitantur. 'ad templum currite', inquit, 'deos nostros fortissime defendite; in summo periculo sunt!' cives ex urbe tota ad templum statim currunt. statuam, quae magna et gravis erat, servi Verris movere non poterant. adhuc funibus laborabant ubi cives accederunt. servi a civibus qui saxa gladiosque cum eis tulerant oppugnabantur, et mox illi fugerunt. duae tamen parvae statuae ad Verrem reportabantur, quod servi sine praeda revenire timent.
